OUTSTANDING PLYMOUTH SCHOOL HONOURED AT SHINE A LIGHT AWARDS FOR ITS COMMITMENT TO DEVELOPING CHILDREN'S COMMUNICATION

Tor Bridge High School in Plymouth has been awarded the Secondary School of the Year Award at an awards ceremony in London for its continued commitment to developing its pupils' communication skills. The **2017 Shine a Light Awards**, run by Pearson in partnership with The Communication Trust, took place on 23rd March 2017 and were hosted by singer and theatre star Gareth Gates.

The 2017 Shine a Light Awards is a national awards scheme that celebrates innovative work and excellent practice in supporting children and young people's communication development.

From the start of Year 7, or on entry, Tor Bridge High undertakes assessments to ascertain its pupils' speech, language and communication skills. From this point on, all staff are encouraged to continuously identify their pupils' needs and gain support for their learners through the inclusion panel meeting that takes place every term.

Uniquely, the school has its own inclusion department featuring a Speech and Language Support Base, a Learning Support strand and the Tamar Learning Centre, which provides support for pupils' social, emotional and mental health needs. The expertise of staff in these three strands is shared across the school to ensure the best provision for each student.

Pupils at Tor Bridge High support their peers, with all students encouraged to deliver one tutor assembly a year, including those with speech, language and communication needs (SLCN). The school has also created a mental health café for students and staff, supporting a communicative environment with close relationships and lines of communication forged between staff and parents.

Carmen De Pablo, Head of Inclusion at Tor Bridge High said: "We are absolutely thrilled and honoured that the work we are doing with our young people is being recognised nationally. This award has fired us up to do even more for our young people in school and across the city."

Gareth Gates, host of the 2017 Shine a Light Awards, said: "The dedication of Tor Bridge High is outstanding. Being able to communicate with confidence is often taken for granted but for many it is an everyday struggle. I have found my stutter crippling at times but I have learnt ways to manage my difficulties with the support of others."

"It is heart warming to know that other children and young people across England are getting the support they need to develop and achieve goals that may not have been possible otherwise. Tor Bridge High should be extremely proud of its award."

Staff are also invested in heavily at Tor Bridge High, with compulsory whole-school staff training given regularly by the staff of the Language Support Centre with a focus on speech, language and communication in the secondary sector.

Initial Teacher Training students and Newly Qualified Teachers are signposted to the Language Support Centre and given advice on how to differentiate in the classroom for speech, language and communication needs (SLCN), while Heads of School refer to the Centre for ongoing assessment of language needs.

Chris Hall, Director of Clinical Assessment at Pearson, said: “Congratulations to Tor Bridge High for their Secondary School of the Year achievement. Their dedication to pupil identification, the Inclusion Department and the extensive training staff receive is amazing. Their innovative approach, particularly the importance of SLCN and the creation of their mental health café, is a great step forward.

“This is the fifth year we have run the Awards and we remain blown away by the standard of applications. They give an amazing insight into the unsung work that is taking place across the country to improve the speech, language and communication skills of children and young people.”
