

The *Cognitive Linguistic Quick Test (CLQT)* enables you to quickly determine severity ratings for five primary domains of cognition (attention, memory, executive functions, language and visuospatial skills) and a Composite Severity Rating for adults with known or suspected neurological impairment due to strokes, head injury or dementia.



CLQT's ten tasks tap specific cognitive skills within a short period and with relatively simple administration and scoring procedures. Use CLQT results to target areas for direct treatment or everyday management of impaired skills, identify the need for more in-depth testing, or help determine a different diagnosis. The full test can be administered at a table or bedside, as long as the patient can sit up and use a pen.
